

Twin Cities METRO System Map










Gold Line BRT Overview







Gold Line Bus Rapid Transit Project Timeline





- 1% design complete through Locally Preferred Alternative process completed by the Gateway Corridor Commission
- Project Development phase to refine design to 30%
- Information is review by smaller groups of technical staff
 - Cities
 - Counties
 - Gold Line Project Office
 - Metro Transit
 - Minnesota Department of Transportation
- Focus on key issues geographically
- Take options to public to provide input to the CMC
