
CBAC Update

- Serving the Twin Cities East Metro: 301,000 jobs/522,000 people by 2040








Review of inputs to 90% Cost Estimate

- Removed Joint Development (Washington County Service Center) from scope
- Schedule Assumptions
 - Start of construction remains in 2022, partial year of construction
 - Additional inflation costs to account for construction schedule risk and 2025 opening
- Bus Propulsion
 - Add 5 electric buses and charging equipment to project scope
 - Maintain 12 diesel buses as project baseline
- Contingency
 - Assumed contingency is 23-28%, but dependent on outcome of Risk Assessment
 - Subject to FTA review and determination for final cost




Contingency Draw-down curve






Grants Expended to Date as of Sept. 1, 2021




Overall Project Schedule



Gold Line Civil Construction Plans 100% Complete!














